There are also end of term parties and discos where learners and staff get to unwind and relax.

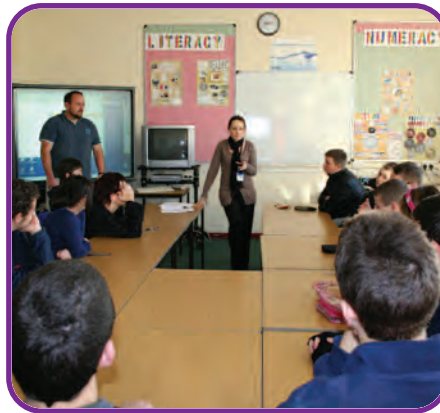
Learning at College
